






Defence Medical Services in Numbers




UK Medical Facilities – DMS has a large dispersed network of sites across the UK1,2



^{1.} Relative PAR indicated by bubble size (distinct scale on each map) except ROHT is set size



DMS Healthcare Delivery Model – Differences and Similarities to NHS


